What the Disability Discrimination Act 2005 and Equality Act 2010 Mean for Washroom Refurbishment

The Disability Discrimination Act 2005 (DDA)—now incorporated into the Equality Act 2010—sets out clear legal obligations around inclusive design.

A Quick Overview of the Legislation

- The Disability Discrimination Act 2005 (DDA) was introduced to protect individuals with disabilities from discrimination in everyday life, including access to facilities in buildings.
- The Equality Act 2010 replaced and built upon the DDA, combining several antidiscrimination laws into one cohesive framework. It legally requires organisations to make "reasonable adjustments" to prevent disabled users from being placed at a disadvantage.

When refurbishing washroom facilities, this means actively removing barriers that could restrict independent use.

Key Requirements for Accessible Washrooms

To comply with the Equality Act 2010 during refurbishment works, facilities must be:

1. Easily Accessible

- Doorways must be wide enough for wheelchair entry.
- Corridors and cubicle access must provide enough turning space.

2. Equipped with Support Features

- Grab rails installed around the toilet and basin.
- Backrests for WCs.
- Alarm systems for emergencies (e.g., pull cords with clear signage).

3. User-Friendly

- Low-level or lever-operated taps.
- Hand dryers and dispensers positioned at accessible heights.
- Contrasting colours to assist visually impaired users.

4. Safe and Navigable

- Slip-resistant flooring.
- Good lighting and tactile signage.
- Clear layout with appropriate signage and visual cues.
